On 27 September, 2020 from 3:00 pm to 4:00 pm NSS Team of SAOE In Collaboration with Bramhand Sansthan organized a webinar on "Supporting Orphanage Via Caring and Education". Webinar was conducted on Digital Platform, YouTube on Channel Awakening Reality. Aman Kumar Tiwari (President of Saoe NSS) contacted the Bramhand Sansthan for conducting webinar in collaboration with NSS team of Saoe.

The Speakers for the webinar were C.M Redkar Sir (Secretary BramhandSansthan, Pune. The Anchors for the webinar were Yogesh Joshi and Yashasvi paunikar. 500+ People attended the live Webinar. Among which few were Members of NSS and others were Non Members of NSS.

The Topics Discussed In Webinar Were –

- 1) What steps can be taken to reduce the no. of orphans?
- 2) What we can do development about orphanages?
- 3) What development is lacking for orphanages?
- 4) What facilities are provided by government for orphanages?
- 5) What about the education of orphans?

A new study by an International Children's Charity's has found that 4 per cent (20 million) of India's child population are orphans. Most of these children have been abandoned by their parents. In fact, the charity estimates that only 0.3 per cent of these orphans are children whose parents have actually died. The high proportion of abandoned children among orphans highlights the fact that poverty is a major reason behind the situation. Indeed, the study found that states such as Uttar Pradesh, Bihar and West Bengal had more orphans than India's richer states. Generally, the country's central and eastern regions were found to be worse affected than the north and the south. Orphaned children are greatly in need of care in protection, being among the most susceptible to poverty, child labor and child trafficking.

The Objective of Bramhand Sansthan is to help orphan people and make them aware about education, social services and environment. Also motivate them by telling them stories about saints, freedom fighters etc.




On 2nd October, 2020 from 12 pm to 1:00 pm NSS Team of SAOE organised a webinar on "PLEDGE FOR EYE DONATION". Webinar was conducted on Digital Platform, Google meet. The Speakers for the webinar were Ankita Pol, Pooja Sahanjwani, Niva Ravjiani. 52+ Volunteers of NSS Team of SAOE attended the live Webinar. Anchor for the Webinar on Pledge for Eye Donation was Shweta Balasaheb Bhagat. In this webinar, the topics that were discussed are as follows:

What is Eye Donation? Who can Donate Eyes? What happens after Donation? What is an Eye Bank? What is Eye Donation after Death? What are Myths about Eye Donation? What are the Functions of an Eye Bank? Which are the centers of Eye Bank in Pune? How the care is taken of the patient afterwards?

After Webinar, All the Members present in the Webinar took a Collective Pledge to Donate Eyes.

According to a WHO report published in 2010, globally, 285 million people suffer from visual challenges. Of these 285 million, 246 million suffer from low vision while the remaining 39 version suffers from blindness. Of the total number of visually impaired and blind people in the world, 65% and 82% respectively, are over 50 years of age. In South East Asia which includes India, over 48 thousand people per million suffer from visual impairment, while over 43 thousand per million suffer from low visibility and over only 6 thousand per million suffer from blindness.

Apart from a few reasons why certain conditions cannot be cured, most people suffer from curable ailments, especially those that can be cured with the help of donated eyes. In India nearly 2- 3 million people suffer from corneal blindness which could be cured through eye donation. Cornea is a clear tissue in our eyes, which allows light to pass through, enabling the brain in comprehending shapes and colours. A person is said to be suffering from corneal blindness when the cornea gets cloudy or obstructed in some other way. This reduces visibility. Now, this can be cured with the help of eye donation, which is an act of donating eye posthumously.


Integrity Pledge for Citizens


