MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Amhi Zadkari Foundation, Pune represented herein by its President, Mr. Khushalsinha Garud (hereinafter referred to as "Second Party", organization whose expression, unless excluded by or repugnant to the subject or context shall include its successors – in-office, administrators and assigns).

(First Party and Second Party are hereinafter jointly referred to as 'Parties' and individually as 'Party') as

I. PURPOSE & SCOPE

The purpose of this MOU is to clearly identify the roles and responsibilities of each party as they relate to the education field and having a good reputation among students.

In particular, this MOU is intended for awareness among students and society.

- Appreciating the need for knowledge exchange between Institute and agency.
- Recognizing the importance of Tree Plantation and Green environment
- Joint collaboration in workshop, webinar and lectures arrangement.
- Facilitation for Eco-friendly campus development.
- Demonstration of Tree Plantation and Green environment advanced techniques
- Field visit and awareness campaign and drives

II. BACKGROUND.

Bee Keeping, Vermi composting, Nature tours etc. The foundation also spreads awareness on how to celebrate environment-friendly festivals. III. Responsibilities Undertaken This MOU: -

- S.K.N. Sinhgad School of Business Management, Ambegaon bk, Pune shall undertake the following activities:
 - Organization of lectures for Tree Plantation and green environment awareness
 - College will promote and support the college students for their involvement in Tree Plantation and green environment drives.
 - College will provide lecture hall, projector, mike and other electronic services for arrangement of seminar/ Lecture on Tree Plantation and green environment sessions.
 - College will engage a maximum number of students for participation in awareness rallies and campaigns.

Amhi Zadkari Foundation shall undertake following activities:

- · Conduct an awareness session on Tree Plantation & Green environment in the institute.
- Mobilize Tree Plantation & Green environment drives for students in the city.
- Facilitate academic projects related to Tree Plantation & Green environment.
- Facilitate E-waste, Plastic waste collection in institute.
- Provide volunteering and internship opportunities to students.

First Party & Second Party believe that collaboration and co-operation between themselves will promote more effective use of each of their resources, and provide each of them with enhanced opportunities.

- The Parties intend to cooperate and focus their efforts on cooperation within the area of Skill Based Training, Education and Research.
- Both Parties, being legal entities in themselves desire to sign this MOU for advancing their mutual interests.

CLAUSE 1 CO-OPERATION

- Both Parties are united by common interests and objectives, and they shall establish channels of communication and co-operation that will promote and advance their respective operations within the **Institution** and its related wings. The Parties shall keep each other informed of potential opportunities and shall share all information that may be relevant to secure additional opportunities for one another.
- 1.2 First Party and Second Party co-operation will facilitate effective utilization of the intellectual capabilities of the faculty. Both Parties will provide significant inputs in developing suitable teaching / training systems, keeping in mind the needs of the industry.
- The general terms of co-operation shall be governed by this MOU. The Parties shall cooperate with each other and shall, as promptly as is reasonably practical, enter into all relevant agreements, deeds and documents (the 'Definitive Documents') as may be required to give effect to the actions contemplated in terms of this MOU. The term of Definitive Documents shall be mutually decided between the Parties. Along with the Definitive Documents, this MOU shall represent the entire understanding as to the subject matter hereof and shall supersede any prior understanding between the Parties on the subject matter hereof.

CLAUSE 2

SCOPE OF THE MOU

- 2.1 The budding post graduates from the institutions could play a key role in technological upgradation, innovation and competitiveness of an industry. Both parties believe that close co-operation between the two would be of major benefit to the student community to enhance their skills and knowledge.
- 2.2 Event organization: Second Party will give valuable inputs to the First Party in teaching / training methodology, vice versa and suitably customize the curriculum so that the students fit into the industrial scenario meaningfully.
- 2.3 **Research and Development:** Both Parties have agreed to carry out the joint research activities in the fields of waste management.
- 2.4 **Skill Development Programs:** Second Party to train the students of First Party on the emerging technologies in order to bridge the skill gap and make them industry ready.

- 2.5 **Guest Lectures:** Both Parties extend the necessary support to deliver guest lectures to the students on the technology trends and in house requirements.
- 2.6 **Placement of Trained Students:** Both Parties will actively engage to help the delivery of the training and placement of students of each other into internships/jobs as per requirement.
- 2.7 Both Parties to obtain all internal approvals, consents, permissions, and licenses of whatsoever nature required for offering the Programmes on the terms specified herein.
- 2.8 There is no financial commitment on the part of the Amhi Zadkari Forundation, Pune, the Second Party and S.K.N. Sinhgad School of Business Management, Ambegaon bk, Pune, the First Party to take up any programme mentioned in the MOU. If there is any financial consideration, it will be dealt separately.

CLAUSE 3

INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

Nothing contained in this MOU shall, by express grant, implication, Estoppel or otherwise, create in either Party any right, title, interest, or license in or to the intellectual property (including but not limited to know-how, inventions, patents, copyrights and designs) of the other Party.

CLAUSE 4

VALIDITY

- 4.1 This Agreement will be valid until it is expressly terminated by either Party on mutually agreed terms, during which period S.K.N.Sinhgad School of Business Management, Ambegaon bk, Pune, the First Party, as the case may be, will take effective steps for implementation of this MOU. Any act on the part of Training Partner or S.K.N.Sinhgad School of Business Management, Ambegaon bk, Pune, the First Party after termination of this Agreement by way of communication, correspondence etc., shall not be construed as an extension of this MOU
- 4.2 Both Parties may terminate this MOU upon 30 calendar day notice in writing. In the event of Termination, both parties have to discharge their obligations

CLAUSE 5

RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN THE PARTIES

It is expressly agreed that First Party and Second Party are acting under this MOU as 5.1 independent contractors, and the relationship established under this MOU shall not be construed as a partnership. Neither Party is authorized to use the other Party's name in any way, to make any representations or create any obligation or liability, expressed or implied, on behalf of the other Party, without the prior written consent of the other Party. Neither Party shall have, nor represent itself as having, any authority under the terms of this MOU to make agreements of any kind in the name of or binding upon the other Party, to pledge the other Party's credit, or to extend credit on behalf of the other Party.

Second Party

Any divergence or difference derived from the interpretation or application of the MOU shall be resolved by arbitration between the parties as per the Arbitration Act, 1996. The place of the arbitration shall be at District Headquarters of the First Party. This undertaking is to be construed in accordance with Indian Law with exclusive jurisdiction in the Courts of Pune.

Brief Report

A guest lecture on the topic 'Aamhi Zadkari 'was organized by our college, on 12th October 2023 under the Institute Social Responsibility cell "PRAYAS", joining hands together for social cause. The session was presented Mr. Khushalsingh Garud, President of Aamhi Zadkari Foundation. The session was on social awareness about tree plantations. The following are some of the points that he preached:

- Ganpati Immersion at home: It speaks to one's heart about the Ganpati Immersion
 that we should do our Ganpati Immersion at home, only as it affects our rivers and
 brook harshly. They gave one suggestion that we can use 'Sheti Mati Ganpati' instead
 of using POP. Sheti mati Ganpati can be easily immersed at home and we can use that
 water for tree plantation.
- Aamhi Zadkari' and 'Sahhayadri Devrai' tie-up for a plantation program. In that
 program, they take seeds of old aged trees for their plantation. It can also help in
 preventing degradation of old aged plants. They took this program every year in
 summer.

3. Seed Rakhi: This initiative was also taken by them in their organization every year. He also invited us to do the same at home as it helps in the tree plantation initiative. He discussed upcoming plans for organization. In that they told us that they are going to start Mahila Bachat Gat under which women's would be allocated with work of beekeeping, it will help rural women's for their livelihood.

 DEVRAI; The ground water campaign: This involves public outreach, education and advocacy to encourage responsible groundwater use, protection of aquifers, or addressing concerns such as pollution or over extraction of ground water.

Organic fertilizer; It contains a lot of organic fertilizer but Sir only discussed worm
organic fertilizer. Their organization also provides training for making and the
usefulness of worm organic fertilizer. 'Vanrai Bandhare', will help rural villages with
the scarcity of water.

6. Their organization also do events like Special Event Tree Plantation Programs. He also invited us to participate in that program. In that program they plant one tree for special events for the person. He also talked about their initiatives in taking care of those trees. They celebrate maintenance day every month. Sir also talked about the program they organize every year. That is 'Pahune zadkari'. In that program, they allow all other people who want to do something for nature can participate in this program.

Outcomes of the activity: 1. Students get aware about the importance of tree plantation to procure future circumstances.

Students were known about Aamhi Zadkari organization and their initiatives in tree plantation.





Report on Entrepreneurship Development Activities

Overview of Events




